From 2007 to 2010 he served as joint venture manager & communication/sustainable development manager for "Pazflor", the largest project then operated by TOTAL, and from 2010 to 2015 he was based in Brussels as delegate for European affairs. Prior to this, he was appointed as senior advisor at the World Bank Group in the Oil, Gas & Mining Policy Division, where he successfully launched the public-private "Global Gas Flaring Reduction" partnership in the Middle East, promoted regional cooperation on gas flaring reduction in the Gulf of Guinea (Cameroon, Equatorial Guinea and Nigeria) and also convinced France and the European Union to join the partnership as donor countries.
