



Power Purchasing Agreements (PPAs) are key for chemicals


Cumulative PPAs signed (MW data 2022)



PPAs from an industrial off-taker perspective

- Why are PPAs important to energy-intensive consumers?
 - They reduce price risks
 - They reduce volume risk
- What obstacles do we see in moving forward?
 - The profile of available PPAs often does not meet the consumption profiles of industrial off-takers
 - The contract length of PPAs can present a challenge, particularly for SMEs.
- How can the PPAs framework be improved ?
 - Facilitate access to aggregation services that offer a portfolio approach and help shape the PPA profile to the needs of different consumers.
 - Implement a consistent Guarantees of Origin framework to facilitate the off-take of PPAs.

High electricity prices are still a major competitive issue *Experience from Chlor-alkali, an electro-intensive Cefic sector group*



Note: Electricity costs for chlor-alkali in the EU are almost 6 times as high as in the US !!!
